WELCOME

Thank you for choosing a Koochi product. Please take a little time to read the important safety notes detailed below. This will ensure many years of happy, safe use.

SAFETY: TAKE NOTE

WARNING: A CHILDS SAFETY IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

WARNING: Never leave your child unattended.

WARNING: Ensure that all locking devices are engaged before use.

WARNING: To avoid injury ensure that your child is kept away when unfolding and folding this product.

WARNING: Do not let your child play with this product.

WARNING: Always use the restraint system.

WARNING: Any load attached to the handle affects the stability of the pushchair.


WARNING: This product is not suitable for running or skating.

- This pushchair is intended for children from birth up to a maximum user weight of 15kg.
- Recline the seat to the most reclined position for new born babies until they can sit up unaided.
- Brake should be engaged when placing and removing the children.
- Children should be harnessed in at all times and never left unattended. The child should be clear of moving parts while making adjustments. This vehicle requires regular maintenance by the user.
- Do not use replacement parts or accessories other than those approved by Koochi as they may render the pushchair unsafe.
- Overloading, incorrect folding, and the use of non-approved accessories or spare parts may damage or break this pushchair and could render the product unsafe.
- Any additional load attached to the handle and/or on the back of the backrest and/or on the sides of the vehicle will affect the stability of the vehicle.
- A basket is provided for the carriage of goods, evenly distributed, up to a maximum weight of 2kg.
- Never leave raincovers on indoors, in a hot atmosphere or near a heat source as the baby could overheat.
- Ensure all users are familiar with the products operation. It should always open and fold easy. If it does not, do not force the mechanism stop and read the instructions.
- Do not use your pushchair in a manner for which it is not designed.
- Ensure your child wears a correctly fitted and adjusted harness at all times. D-rings are provided on the existing harness for the attachment of a separate safety harness approved to BS EN 13210 should this be required.

- Do not allow your child to climb unassisted into, play with or hang onto your pushchair.
- Do not use a platform with this pushchair as it may render the pushchair unsafe.
- Always apply the brakes when the pushchair is stationary. Hold on to your pushchair when close to moving road vehicles or trains. Even with the brake on the draught from the vehicle may move the pushchair.
- Exercise caution when mounting or dismounting a kerb. Remove your child and fold the pushchair when ascending or descending stairs or escalators.
- Ensure the folded pushchair is stored away from children so that it does not fall and cause injury.
- Never carry a second child on your pushchair.
- This product complies with BS EN 1888:2012

OPERATION

1. LIST OF PARTS

Your pushchair is supplied in one carton and contains:

- 1. Pushchair
- 2. Front wheel assembly (x2)
- 3. Hood

- 5. Raincover
- 6. Drink holder
 7. Changing bag

- 4. Footmuff
- 2. OPENING THE PUSHCHAIR

Release the autocatch by pulling the bottom of the catch forward (a) Lift the handles (b) to unfold the chassis.

Push down on lever (c) with your foot until the chassis locks in the open position.

WARNING: Ensure that all locking devices are engaged before use.

3. FITTING THE FRONT WHEELS

Fit a front wheel by placing the front leg of the pushchair frame into the hole at the top of the wheel assembly. Push down hard on the leg (a) until it clicks into place. Check that the leg is protruding through the bottom of the wheel assembly (b) and the tabs have locked the wheel assembly in place.

Repeat this process for the remaining front wheel.

To remove a front wheel assembly press in the tabs (c) and pull the wheel assembly off the leg.

4. USING THE SWIVEL WHEEL LOCK

Engaging the swivel lock: Move the front wheel assembly (a) until the locking levers are facing forward. Push the lever down to engage the swivel lock (b).

Releasing the swivel lock: Lift the lever to release the swivel lock (c).

5. USING THE BRAKE

Press down on one of the levers with your foot to engage the brakes (a).

Lift the lever to release the brake (b).

It is recommended that you test the brake is engaged by trying to push the stroller for a short distance.

NOTE: Always apply brake before loading or unloading a child from the pushchair.

6. ADJUSTING THE HEIGHT OF THE SEAT

The adjuster for raising and lowering the seat position is located behind the seat.

To lower the back rest push the button downwards to unlock the adjuster (a) and slide the adjuster until the seat is in the desired position (b).

To raise the backrest slide the adjuster upwards (c) whilst holding webbing (d).

7. ADJUSTING THE CALF SUPPORT

To adjust the position of the calf support press the buttons (a) on either side of the pushchair and lift (b) or lower (c) the calf support.

Release the buttons when the calf support is in the desired position.

8. USING THE HARNESS

A five point harness is provided to restrain your child.

To fasten the harness push the shoulder strap clips on to the waist strap clips (a) then the waist strap clips into the buckle (b) until they lock in place.

To unfasten push the button in the centre of the button (c) then pull the waist straps clear.

The harness should be carefully adjusted so your child fits comfortably. The length of the shoulder straps can be changed by the strap adjusters (d). The waist straps can be adjusted by pressing in the buttons (e) on the waist strap clips and the strap adjusters (f).

'D' rings (g) are fitted should you wish to attach a separate harness complying to BS EN 13210.

WARNING: Always use the crotch strap in combination with the waist belt

9. ADUSTING THE HARNESS HEIGHT AND REMOVING THE HARNESS

There are two height positions for the shoulder straps. To adjust the height of the shoulder straps push the plastic clips through from the rear of the seat unit (a) then push the clips back through the slots at the desired height.

The harness can be removed for cleaning purposes. To remove the crotch strap & shoulder straps push the plastic clips through from the rear (a) of under (b) the seat unit. To remove the waist straps, first unfasten the webbing by feeding the edge of the webbing through the opening in the metal clip (c) and push the metal clips through from the rear of the seat unit.

To refit the harness and chest pads reverse the instructions above.

10. FITTING THE FOOTMUFF

Release the harness buckle and slide the chest pads off the shoulder straps and the crotch pad off the crotch strap (a).

Push the shoulder straps through the slots in the footmuff (b).

Push the waist straps through the slots in the footmuff (c).

Push the buckle and crotch strap through the slot in the footmuff (d).

Put the Velcro $\ensuremath{\mathbb{R}}$ strips on the top of the footmulf over the seat and fasten to the back of the seat (e).

Refit the chest pads to the shoulder straps and refasten the harness.

Removal of the footmuff is the reversal of this procedure.

11. FITTING AND USING THE HOOD

Place the back of the hood over the back of the pushchair as shown.

Slide the clips at the base of the hood hinge on to the mounts on either side of the pushchair (a) until they lock in position.

Velcro® strips secure the hood material at (b). Further Velcro® strips are fitted to the seat back and the inside which can be attached when the seat is in lower positions.

To remove the hood release the Velcro® strips and then push the clips off the pushchair on either side (c).

To raise the hood, pull the top of the hood forward (d) then push down on the hood stays (e) until the hood locks in place.

To lower the hood, lift the hood stays (f) then push the top of the hood (g) back into it's folded position.

To open the sunvisor, pull the material out from inside the hood (h). Push it back to close the sunvisor (i).

12. REMOVING THE BASKET

Your shopping basket is removable for easier cleaning. To remove the shopping basket, undo the press studs at the back of the basket (a) and the straps (b) at the front. To refit the shopping basket, simply reverse the above process. Maximum load 2kg (4lb).

13. FITTING THE DRINKS HOLDER

Push the drinks holder on to the fixing (a) located on the upper hinge.

Push the bottle holder from underneath to remove it from the pushchair.

14. FITTING THE RAINCOVER

Lay the raincover over the pushchair as shown.

Secure the raincover to the each side of the hood with the press studs (a) and the popper straps (b) to the pushchair legs below the footrest.

15. FOLDING YOUR PUSHCHAIR

Lift the handle (a) then press down with your foot on the locking lever (b) so that the pushchair starts to fold.

When fully closed the autocatch should engage (c).

Push down on the handles until the pushchair is fully folded (c).

Once folded push the folding catch (d) onto the chassis locking pin to secure the pushchair in the folded position.

CARE

Your pushchair has been designed to meet safety standards and with correct use and maintenance will give many years of trouble free performance.

The chassis is strong but will weaken should the rear wheels be bumped down stairs or kerbs. Continual impact will cause damage.

If your child wears hard shoes these might damage the soft fabric.

Storing a damp pushchair will encourage mildew to form.

After exposure to damp conditions, dry off with a soft cloth, open fully and allow to dry thoroughly before storing.

Store your pushchair in a dry, safe place.

Do not leave the pushchair in sunlight for prolonged periods - some fabrics may fade.

MAINTENANCE

This pushchair requires regular maintenance by the user.

Koochi products are designed to operate with minimum maintenance, however regular

lubrication of moving parts will extend the life of your pushchair and make opening and folding easier.

Should parts of your pushchair become stiff or difficult to operate, apply a light application of a spray lubricant e.g. silicone. Do not use oil or grease.


Regularly inspect the locking devices, brakes, wheels, harness assembly, catches, seat adjusters, joints and fixtures to ensure they are secure and in full working order. They should be free to move at all times.


Brakes and wheels are subject to wear and should be replaced if necessary.


Your pushchair should be serviced and reconditioned before using it for a second baby, or within 18 months, whichever is the sooner.


CLEANING


The hood may be cleaned by sponging lightly using warm water and a mild detergent. Plastic and metal parts may be sponged clean with warm water and a mild detergent. Never clean with abrasive, ammonia based, bleach based or spirit type cleaners. Please follow the wash care instructions stated on the wash care label located on the soft goods.

















